Since the film's release, 70 countries have ratified the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (TPNW), a significant increase, underscoring the growing global momentum for disarmament. "The Vow From Hiroshima" has played a crucial role in raising awareness and inspiring action, winning the prestigious 2021 Japan Film Renaissance Conference Peace Film Award.
