Team,

Thank you for responding so quickly. As you know, the international armed conflict between Gorah and Dable has increased in intensity faster than either State seems to have anticipated. As such, we are especially concerned that both sides are ill-equipped to meet their IHL obligations towards managing prisoners of war.

Thanks to some high-level outreach, Dable's Minister of Defense has arranged for you to have a brief initial visit to the recently established Derry Prison Camp to evaluate the conditions of the camp and try to speak with detainees. Dable sees this visit as an opportunity to prove that it is serious about IHL compliance on the global stage, so be sure to act with decorum in keeping with our core principles and ways of working.

You will have to meet with the camp commander, LtCol Marcie Stanler, upon entering the camp. Be sure to be able to explain who you are and the role of the ICRC. I've attached a media report that has collated some rumors about the conditions at Derry. When speaking to detainees, be mindful of any IHL concerns you identify from their testimony about their treatment and camp conditions.

SUDDEN BORDER CONFLICT ERUPTS BETWEEN GORAH AND DABLE

A full-scale war has erupted between Gorah and Dable, two neighboring nations long locked in a fragile truce that collapsed overnight after a series of cross-border strikes. The hostilities, which began less than 48 hours ago, have already spiraled into one of the fastest-escalating military crises in recent memory.

According to regional observers, the offensive began early Monday morning when Gorah launched a coordinated barrage of artillery and drone attacks across multiple points along their shared border. Within hours, multiple armored divisions crossed the border, reportedly advancing more than 30 kilometers into Dable's territory.

Military analysts say the assault's speed and precision indicate months of preparation by Gorah. "This was not a border skirmish," said Col. Jack Burrell, a defense analyst based in the Crawn Republic. "Gorah executed a pre-planned blitz designed to overwhelm Dable's defenses, taking advantage of Dable's focus on the FEW Collective conflict before they could even mobilize."

Sources within Dable's defense ministry, speaking under condition of anonymity, admitted that their forces were "completely unprepared" for the scale of the offensive. Satellite images released by independent analysts show extensive damage to several key airfields and logistical hubs, suggesting that Dable's early air response was effectively neutralized.

In a televised address, Dable's Prime Minister Bill Brown vowed to "repel the aggression by any means necessary," declaring a state of emergency and initiating a nationwide mobilization of reserve forces. Meanwhile, Gorah's government described its actions as a "defensive operation" aimed at "neutralizing security threats" allegedly emanating from across the border, claims that international observers have so far found unsubstantiated.

As the conflict intensifies, rumors have begun to surface regarding the treatment of prisoners of war, with both sides already capturing soldiers from the other side. In particular, several war bloggers claim to have received word, albeit through unverifiable channels, that Dable is using captured Gorah soldiers for dangerous labor programs to sustain its military logistics and reconstruction efforts. Compounding these concerns, many prisoners of war captured by Dable during its first counterattack have not been heard from since their capture, raising international alarm about their safety and treatment in detention.

A spokesperson from Dable's Defense Ministry decried such rumors as a misinformation campaign, saying "Dable has the utmost respect for international law and constantly strives to comply with our legal obligations therein. Any suggestions to the contrary are surely the work of Gorah aligned malefactors seeking to further their unjustifiable war against our great nation."
